The potent mix of passionate gypsy music and the intense ecstatic cadences of Sufi devotional chant leads to an electrifying result. Together with their own musicians on stage, the JAADU project - meaning 'magic' in Arabic - was recorded in Germany during their recent European tour. "There was a truly transcendental musical confluence in the Barbican last night. Pakistani devotional singing met fiery Spanish flamenco." (London Evening Standard)

She holds a Ph.D in Composition from Trinity College, where she also lectures.
