for billions of organisms. Soil is home to a quarter of the earth's species. In Ireland there are 10 main soil groups, and peat is one of them. Peat is the soil found in bogs. Irish Bogs are really special not only for the amazing creatures and plants that live there, but also as one of our greatest resources to combat climate change. Peatlands are the largest natural land carbon store. They store more carbon than all other vegetation types in the world combined.
